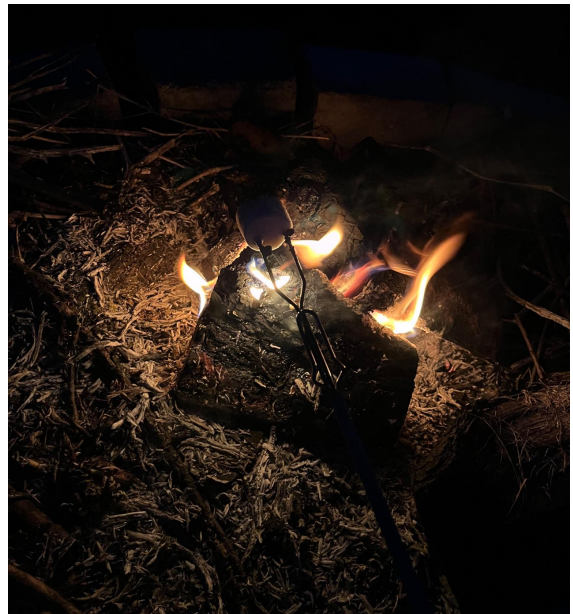


Dear Friend:

Touring the Wastewater Treatment Plant

However, for the past three years, I have gotten a tour of Twinsburg’s Wastewater Treatment Plant, run by Director Nathan Zuege with the rest of the Environmental Commission. The first time I toured the plant, I remember walking away from the tour with my head spinning. The amount of science, technology, and pure information that goes into running the Wastewater Plant 24/7 365 is astounding. After this last tour, I walked away finally feeling I understand a bit more as to what goes on in the treatment process. It is very cool and inspiring to see all of the hard-work and dedication that Nathan, and every other operator puts into the care of the plant. With such a small staff, they are able to make sure the plant is well maintained, and outdated equipment is still functional to ensure the discharge into Tinkers Creek is the cleanest it can be. On

the tour, the future of the plant was also discussed. This plant has always taken a future forward approach to planning and maintenance. Hearing the passion of Nathan Zuege as he discussed how he believes we

can responsibly update the plant to ensure it lasts another 75 years was important to me as a resident. What I additionally appreciate about our City, and hardworking Directors such as Nathan Zuege, is they are transparent, and the Wastewater Treatment plant is open to the public via tours if scheduled ahead of time. The Broadway/Richmond/Macedonia Rd project kicked off on April 1st. The first phase of construction will be between Richmond Road and Pettibone Road.

During this first phase, traffic will be maintained in the northbound direction (heading out of Twinsburg toward I-271). Southbound traffic will be detoured via eastbound Pettibone Road and southbound Richmond Road. The project is expected to be expansive. Current completion ETA November 2025.
