Shred Day Recap!

Shred Day was another great success this year!

In recent years, we've filled the shred truck to capacity, giving residents a safe and secure way to dispose of sensitive documents. Last year, the truck reached capacity before 11:00 a.m., prompting the City of Twinsburg to add a second Shred Day later in the year.

This year, the City took a different approach by adding a second truck to our annual event, helping ensure everyone who wanted to participate had the opportunity to do so.

A big thank you to the hardworking members of our Service Department and my fellow Environmental Commission members for helping make the event run smoothly. With two trucks on site, we collected approximately **18,000 pounds** of sensitive documents that were securely shredded on-site.

Events like this may not always be the most visible, but they provide a valuable service to our community. Based on this year's success, I'll be advocating for two shred trucks again next year so we can continue meeting the strong demand from our residents.



Second Shred Opportunity



I have gotten messages from some residents who missed the Shred Day event, and were curious if another would be held. While The City of Twinsburg does not have another Shred Day planned for the 2026 calendar year, I was able to find one being put on by the Summit Metro Parks.
